THE ROSALIE - \$18

Reposado Tequila, house made hibiscus syrup, agave, fresh squeezed lime juice, cinnamon sugar rim

Rosalie was the wife of John F. Dimon and a native of Peru. Rosalie lived at the Dimon Estate with her 3 daughters for much of the late 19th century enduring both heartbreak and scandal.

THE SEA WITCH - \$16

House-infused Ginger Gin, house made honey syrup, fresh squeezed lemon juice

The Sea Witch was a famed extreme clipper ship built by Smith & Dimon in 1846. Operating in the China Tea Trade, she set a record of 74 days from Hong Kong to New York that was not bested until 2003. This record is still unbroken by a mono-hulled sailing vessel.

THE HUDSON - \$17

Belvedere Lemon Basil Vodka, fresh squeezed lemon juice, simple syrup, muddled basil leaves splash of club soda

A wooden hulled, three-masted frigate built in 1826 for the Greek government by Smith & Dimon. When they were unable to pay for the ship, she was put into service patrolling the South Atlantic to help eradicate the insidious slave trade.

THE FRAZIER - \$18

Woodford Reserve Bourbon, turmeric, fresh squeezed lemon juice, saffron and mint

Named for the captain of the Sea Witch, murdered by his first mate off the coast of Rio de Janiero, see details from the trial in the New York Times article featured in the upstairs study.

SMITH & DIMON - \$17

Bulleit Rye, Amaro Nonino, Fonseca tawny port, local maple syrup, bitters

Smith & Dimon was a renowned shipyard on the lower East Side of Manhattan in the 1840s. It was founded by Stephen Smith and John Dimon, who was in charge of the more profitable ship repair business and described the partnership saying, "Smith builds the ships, I make the money."

THE JOHN DIMON MARTINI - \$18

Kettle-One Vodka, Cointreau, pomegranate juice, lemon juice, simple syrup

Generations of John Dimon's called this property home: a farmer, a revolutionary war minuteman, a shipbuilder and a merchant mariner who became the wealthiest man in Jamesport.
